Let's get everything out of it!" These fine actors, musicians and technicians did exactly what they were trained to do, whether it was their first time on stage or they were seasoned veterans. They never looked back and built this show night after night to receive three, well deserved, consecutive standing ovations.

In the end it was a fantastic experience and the most beautiful part is to look around campus and to see the new friendships that blossomed from the production because they all were able to share this experience together. It is definitely a wonderful thing to see the pride of the parents and the students and the school because everyone knows that they did a first rate job and that for two months we created magic in The Robert B.
